Activities & events

The rangers run a varied events programme every year. **Activities range from large trail events**, such as the popular Halloween trail, to bat walks, photography workshops and art and craft events.

For more formal visits to the Country Park, an **education pack and resources** are available for local schools and community groups to borrow.

A **tactile map**, created by the RNIB and located next to Ninesprings Café, will help anyone with a visual impairment to find their way around Ninesprings, and a downloadable audio trail will assist visitors in discovering more about the history of the country park.

Fitness

If you are keen to try something a bit more energetic, there are various fitness activities to try; some are self-led trails and some are run by instructors.

The **3,2,1 Run England** 3k running routes are waymarked in Ninesprings and Riverside. The Blackburn fitness trail, a self-led exercise trail, runs through Ninesprings following information on a leaflet.

Looking after the park



Volunteers help with activities throughout the park and practical volunteer teams operate on Monday afternoons and all day on Thursdays. The volunteers help with habitat management, practical park maintenance and heritage restoration. Volunteers also help with events and wildlife surveys.

A small team of **professional rangers** look after the country park; managing the habitats, conserving the wildlife and maintaining the park for visitors to enjoy. The rangers also deliver the events programme and run the volunteer teams.

A growing number of **fitness classes and events** for all abilities are held within the Country Park.

Cycling is popular through the Country Park, and the shared pedestrian & cycle path, following the old railway line linking Ninesprings with Summerhouse Hill and Wyndham Hill, is a great off-road route to avoid cycling through town. It is also a great place for children to practise their cycling skills.

Ninesprings Café

Ninesprings Café is the focal point for information about the country park. All trail leaflets are available here, as well as information about the history and wildlife of the park.

The café is open all year round (except Christmas Day) and provides a wonderful setting in which to enjoy hot and cold drinks, sandwiches, cakes, ice cream and snacks. The café is family friendly with baby change facilities and books & activities for children to use.

Exploring the Park

Yeovil Country Park is a fantastic urban edge greenspace that follows Dodham Brook and the River Yeo along the south-eastern edge of Yeovil, encompassing five distinct areas.

Close to the town centre, visit **Penn Hill Park**, once the gardens of Penn House, with beautiful views across the town. From there, head out towards the most famous area of site, the Victorian valley gardens of **Ninesprings**, with meandering paths, grottoes, streams and springs.

Follow the cycleway and reach **Summerhouse Hill**, a steeply-sloping

grassy field leading out to wider countryside. Follow along the track towards **Wyndham Hill**, where the famous landmark of the four lime trees towers over the town of Yeovil, and climb to the summit to admire the view. Continue past the river and across the road to **Riverside**, a beautiful corridor of woodland and grassland home to others, many insects and birds.

Dogs are welcome

Dogs are welcome throughout Yeovil Country Park except in the 'No Dogs' zone around the lake, in order to protect the sensitive wildlife living there.

BBQs and picnics

A number of picturesque picnic spots are located throughout the Country Park and there is a designated BBQ area at Ninesprings.
